RESOLUTION 28-22

Sponsored by the Committee on Rules:

A RESOLUTION CONCERNING SUPPORT FOR UKRAINE AGAINST ONGOING RUSSIAN AGGRESSION

WHEREAS, on January 21, 1990, more than 400,000 Ukrainians joined hands and called for independence from the Soviet Union, forming a human chain that stretched for 400 miles from the city of Ivano-Frankivsk to Kyiv; and

WHEREAS, on August 24, 1991, a date that is still celebrated as Ukraine's official Independence Day, the Ukrainian Parliament declared independence from Russia; and

WHEREAS, on December 1, 1991, 92% of Ukrainian citizens voted in support of forming a nation independent from Russia, and on December 26, 1991, the Soviet Union officially dissolved; and

WHEREAS, in 1992, Ukraine formally established a positive relationship with the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO), and became the first member state of the Commonwealth of Independent States to join the Partnership for Peace program; and

WHEREAS, for over 70 years NATO has relied on peace, diplomacy, and open and transparent communication over conflicts in order to ensure safety and stability for over 1 billion people; and

WHEREAS, On February 20, 2014, the Russian Federation, seeking to deny the free-will of the Ukrainian people, invaded the independent state of Ukraine and has instigated a deadly separatist war that has destabilized the region and killed thousands; and

WHEREAS, over the last several years, Ukraine has been forced to confront hostile and unwarranted acts by Russia, with the ongoing attempted annexation of Crimea, and conflict in the Donbas region; and

WHEREAS, since the beginning of the conflict with Russia, at least 14,000 Ukrainians have been killed, and millions displaced, defending their homeland; and

WHEREAS, on February 23, 2022, despite strong international opposition and imposed sanctions, the Russian military began an unprovoked, brutal assault on the peaceful people of Ukraine, inflicting terror and violence upon individuals and destroying the homes and businesses of millions; and

WHEREAS, the United States and United Nations recognize Ukraine as an independent, sovereign nation that has been unjustly invaded and threatened; now therefore be it

RESOLVED, that the Schenectady County Legislature stands in solidarity with Ukraine and commends the strength and courage of the Ukrainian people in their pursuit of protecting their independence, democracy, and most importantly, their homeland; and therefore, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Schenectady County Legislature condemns the unnecessary actions of Russia in its devastating, ongoing assault and urges the United States federal government and its allies to take every appropriate action to aid and relieve those who are suffering in Ukraine.

A RESOLUTION HONORING THE JOHN F. KENNEDY DIVISION 1 OF THE ANCIENT ORDER OF HIBERNIANS TOGETHER WITH THE JOHN F. KENNEDY DIVISION 1 OF THE LADIES ANCIENT ORDER OF HIBERNIANS AND ALL IMMIGRANTS FROM IRELAND AND THEIR DESCENDENTS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY OF SCHENECTADY ON THE OCCASION OF THE FEAST OF SAINT PATRICK, MARCH 17

WHEREAS, The County of Schenectady is rightly proud of its many Irish residents, whether they are Immigrants or Descendants of Immigrants, as well as their many contributions to the general welfare of Schenectady County; and

WHEREAS, The John F. Kennedy Division 1, Ancient Order of Hibernians together with the John F. Kennedy Division 1 Ladies Ancient Order of Hibernians has in fact contributed to the general welfare of the County of Schenectady for over 142 years and 128 years, respectively, by its many financial donations and the performance of various good works for worthy causes and deserving organizations; and

WHEREAS, 2022 marks the 50th anniversary of Bloody Sunday, when 26 unarmed civilians were shot, and 14 killed, by British soldiers during a protest that began peacefully in Derry, Bloody Sunday became one of the most significant and deadly injustices to take place during the Troubles, and exacerbated the conflict in Northern Ireland; and

WHEREAS, on June 15, 2010, then-Prime Minister David Cameron while addressing the House of Commons apologized on behalf of the British Government saying that the events that took place on Bloody Sunday were “unjustified”, “unjustifiable”, and “wrong”; and

WHEREAS, accountability and justice for the victims of Bloody Sunday would represent one step toward addressing Northern Ireland’s legacy of violence, promote reconciliation, and foster intercommunity relations as well as integration in civil and societal structures to promote communication and mutual understanding; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the Schenectady County Legislature—

- (1) supports dialogue and negotiation between all parties to maintain peace;
- (2) supports the full implementation of the Good Friday Agreement to ensure peace and stability on the island of Ireland;
- (3) supports efforts that the involved parties fully implement the Northern Ireland Protocol as agreed upon in the interest of maintaining peace and stability on the island of Ireland;
- (4) supports efforts that the people of Northern Ireland foster further integration across communities and break down cultural, religious, and societal barriers that remain;
- (5) supports the devolved government of Northern Ireland and recognizes the devolved government as a successful outcome and tenet of the Good Friday Agreement; and therefore, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Schenectady County Legislature declares that on March 17, 2022, St. Patrick’s Day shall be celebrated throughout the County of Schenectady in memory of those who lost their lives on Bloody Sunday, Northern

Ireland in 1972, and in recognition of the many contributions and good works of Irish-American people everywhere.

WHEREAS, section 3-302 of the New York State Election Law provides that a County shall pay voting machine technicians and custodians for their services in an amount fixed by the Board of Elections and approved by the County legislative body; and

WHEREAS, this Governing Body recognizes that the American Library Association (ALA) in 2018 adopted a resolution, which states that monetary fines do not serve the core mission of a modern library and are discriminatory in nature; and

WHEREAS, this Governing Body recognizes that the New York Library Association formally endorsed the ALA resolution in 2019; and

WHEREAS, this Governing Body recognizes that currently approximately 25% of SCPL library cardholders owe more than \$5.00 in late fines, which effectively prevents these persons from borrowing materials, using computers, or participating in other services; and

WHEREAS, this Governing Body finds that the imposition of late fines serves as a barrier to equitable access, does not prove to be an incentive for the return of library materials, and causes library staff to incur additional administrative duties to record and collect such fines; and

WHEREAS, this Governing Body recognizes that numerous libraries in the Mohawk Valley Library System, the Upper Hudson Library System, and the Southern Adirondack Library System do not assess late fines; and

WHEREAS, this Governing Body recognizes that there are available non-monetary strategies to ensure that library collections are returned timely, such as programmed limits on the number and type of materials borrowed, restrictions on checkout of additional materials until other items are returned, and better utilization of overdue notifications; now, therefore be it

RESOLVED, that this Governing Body recommends that the Board of Trustees of the Schenectady County Public Library System adopt a policy eliminating the

imposition of late fines, and that such Trustees also implement various additional non-monetary strategies to ensure that the library collections are returned timely.

WHEREAS, the Sustainability Coordinator for Schenectady County advises that if Schenectady County converted three hundred forty-eight (348) streetlights to more energy efficient LED lights it would annually save approximately \$37,038.81 in energy usage and tariffs; and

WHEREAS, the Sustainability Coordinator for Schenectady County further advises that such conversion by the County would reduce annual energy usage by 235,138 kWh and carbon dioxide emissions by 167 metric tons annually; and
